Monday 13th November- Book Sale

We ask that you all have a sort out at home to see if you have any suitable children's books in good condition that you would be happy to donate. If so, please send them into school no later than 9:00am on Monday 13th November so that they can be sorted ready for the book sale event. Books can simply be taken in with your child to the classroom at the start of the day.

Wednesday 13th November- Phonics Fly on the Wall

Parents of pupils in Elm and Willow Classes are invited to attend our upcoming fly on the wall event on Wednesday morning at 9:15am. This is a chance to watch your child's phonics session in progress and then ask Mrs Swinburne any questions you may have about supporting your child at home. Mrs Swinburne will be available in the middle area at the end of the Phonics session. She heads up the development of phonics as part of her leadership role.

Send in your photos of Extreme Reading

We have set all pupils (except Birch Class) a fun reading task as part of our focus on Reading. They need to get their photograph taken while they were reading in an unusual place or strange position as part of our whole school 'Exciting Reading Competition 2017'.

If your child is in Willow, Elm, Maple, Beech or Oak, we ask that you take a photo of them reading in an unusual place, print it out and send it into school by Wednesday 15th November ready to be displayed. Entries will be judged on Wednesday 15th November. If you don't have access to a printer, you can email it to the school office. If your child is in Birch Class, they have already completed this task and their photos will be used as part of the whole school competition. Isaac (Y2) won the y2 internal competition.

There will be prizes for the winning entries and we can't wait to celebrate reading together in this way.
