

## Parking at The Lambley Village Kitchen

The Lambley Village Kitchen kindly allow parents to make use of their car park at drop off and pick-up time. We want to do everything we can to ensure that we are good neighbours, showing respect and gratitude to the fact they allow us to use these parking facilities.

To avoid difficulties, we are setting out clear guidelines to be followed by all members of our school community who are car park users and we will add these guidelines to our Home-School Agreement when it is updated later this year. Please read these three rules and check the aerial plan to ensure you are clear of where you can and where you can't park.

A team of volunteers take turns to direct people to suitable parking spaces and away from any areas we are not permitted to use. Please treat these kind individuals with courtesy and respect and please also consider signing up to take your turn on the rota.

1. NO PARKING at all, and at any time in the disabled spaces and the row from there down to the entrance. This ensures there is always disabled parking available to customers and also allows access for delivery vans throughout the day. A small number of afternoon customers are also then available to park their cars and this is enough on most days at pick up time.
2. NO PARKING from anyone at all when notices have gone out regarding an event. We try to warn you in advance that their car park is going to be out of use when the pub is expecting a party of people for a large booking such as a wake or family event.
3. NO PARKING in the car park if you are going off to spend time in the Parish park play area but find alternative parking on Main Street or in the school car park if it is after pick up time. Our school drive is back open for use after 3:45pm and the School and Village Hall car park is not closed off in the evenings at present.
